In addition, modern studies have shown a strong relationship between pronunciation and listening comprehension. James Scrivener states that pronunciation practice helps learners recognize spoken language more effectively, as they become familiar with sound patterns and connected speech. Moreover, Adrian Underhill emphasizes the importance of teaching pronunciation through interactive and physical activities, such as using mouth movements and phonemic charts[2]. He believes that active engagement helps learners improve both their speaking and listening skills. Overall, these studies suggest that pronunciation is not an isolated skill but an integral part of language learning that supports communication, comprehension, and learner confidence.

Pronunciation has also been widely discussed as a key factor in achieving communicative competence in a foreign language. According to Gerald Kelly, pronunciation teaching should focus on helping learners understand how sounds function in connected speech rather than teaching isolated sounds only. He emphasizes that features such as linking, assimilation, and weak forms are essential for natural communication. For example, phrases like “*want to*” are often pronounced as “*wanna*” in natural speech, and learners who are not aware of such patterns may struggle both in speaking and listening. Kelly’s work highlights that pronunciation is not only about accuracy but also about fluency and naturalness in communication.

Furthermore, Mark Hancock focuses on the practical aspects of teaching pronunciation in the classroom. He suggests that teachers should use engaging and communicative activities to help students improve their pronunciation. According to Hancock, activities such as games, songs, and minimal pair exercises make pronunciation practice more effective and enjoyable. For instance, practicing minimal

pairs like “*bat*” and “*bad*” helps learners distinguish between similar sounds and avoid common mistakes. He also points out that visual and auditory support, such as phonemic symbols and audio recordings, can significantly enhance learners’ understanding. His approach shows that pronunciation teaching should be interactive, learner-centered, and integrated into everyday classroom practice.

Pronunciation plays a central role in how effectively learners can use English in real-life communication. One of the key issues observed in many classrooms is that students may have a good knowledge of grammar and vocabulary, but they still struggle to express themselves clearly due to incorrect pronunciation. For instance, learners often confuse similar sounds such as /ɪ/ and /i:/. Words like “*ship*” and “*sheep*” may be pronounced incorrectly, which can lead to misunderstandings. If a student says “I saw a sheep in the sea” instead of “ship,” the meaning changes completely[3]. This example shows how even small pronunciation errors can affect communication.

Another important aspect is word stress and sentence stress. In English, stress can change the meaning of a word. For example, the word “*record*” can be pronounced as **REcord** (noun) or **reCORD** (verb). Many learners are not aware of this difference, which can cause confusion during conversations. In addition, sentence stress helps speakers highlight important information. If a learner says every word with the same stress, their speech may sound unnatural and difficult to understand. Therefore, teaching stress patterns is as important as teaching individual sounds.

Furthermore, pronunciation has a strong impact on listening comprehension. Students who do not practice pronunciation often find it difficult to understand native speakers. For example, in natural speech, phrases like “*going to*” are often pronounced as “*gonna*”. If learners are not familiar with this, they may not recognize the phrase in listening tasks. Similarly, connected speech, such as “*next day*” pronounced as /*neks dei*/, can be challenging for learners. This shows that improving pronunciation also helps learners decode spoken language more effectively[4].

Another key point is the psychological effect of pronunciation on learners. Many students feel anxious when speaking English because they are afraid of being judged for their pronunciation. For example, a student may know the correct answer in class but choose to remain silent because they are unsure how to pronounce certain words. However, when learners practice pronunciation regularly through activities like repetition, role-plays, and minimal pair exercises, they gradually become more confident. As their confidence increases, they participate more actively in communication.

Finally, it is important to consider the role of teaching methods in improving pronunciation. Traditional methods often focus less on pronunciation, but modern approaches encourage interactive techniques. For example, teachers can use phonemic charts, visual demonstrations of mouth movements, and listening exercises to help students understand how sounds are produced. Technology also plays a useful role;

language learning apps and online videos allow learners to practice pronunciation independently. These methods make learning more engaging and effective.

In conclusion, pronunciation is a vital component of English language learning that significantly influences learners' ability to communicate effectively. As discussed, correct pronunciation helps avoid misunderstandings, improves listening comprehension, and builds learners' confidence in speaking. Even though many students focus primarily on grammar and vocabulary, without proper pronunciation their communication may remain unclear and ineffective. Therefore, pronunciation should be given equal importance in the learning process.
